METHODOLOGY NOTE

Methodology: ComRes interviewed 1,069 British adults aged 18+ online on 24th June 2016. Data were weighted to be representative of all UK adults aged 18+. ComRes sets quotas during fieldwork and weights the raw data on the following demographic information: age, gender and government office region. Additionally the data is weighted by social grade and by past vote recall to the EU referendum.
