Methodology: ComRes interviewed 2,082 British adults online between 29th May and 9th June 2019. Data were weighted to be representative of British adults by age, gender and region. ComRes also interviewed 1,015 British fathers, weighted to be representative of British adults by age, gender and region, with all ineligible respondents removed.
